Bravell Nesbitt

Bravell Nesbitt, resident of Englewood for 43 years, and widowed, with a son and daughter, enlisted in the United States Army in 1955 and served until 1958 in the Korean War with the Fourth Armored Division at Fort Hood in Texas and later with the 27th Anti-Aircraft Battalion stationed at Fort MacArthur in Southern California, performing target tracking in the military's anti-missile program. Prior to being drafted, Nesbitt joined the Junior Air Reserve in 1944 at age 12 after being inspired by his uncle, Major Leroy Allen, a member of the Tuskegee Airmen and who later ran the military hospital in Tuskegee after World War II. Nesbitt flew as a seaplane pilot with the Raven Flying Club of Englewood and Teaneck which later became the Tuskegee Auxiliary Airmen. Nesbitt represents the 369th Veterans Association and American Legion Post 58 where he is presently their chaplain. He is the owner of the Nesbitt Funeral Home and wishes that more veterans and adults would reach out to the youth and give them guidance.

Richard Krane

Richard Krane, resident of Englewood for 55 years and married, with two daughters and seven grandchildren, enlisted in the United States Army in 1957 and served until 1959 in the Korean War as a weapons repair instructor at several bases throughout the country, full term active duty. He was discharged with rank of Specialist Fourth Class. After the War, Krane joined the Englewood Volunteer Ambulance Corps in 1963 after the owner of the Sol & Sol Deli, also a member of the Corps, asked him to help out on a call about a fall that had occurred at the Flat Rock Brook Nature Center. Since joining, Krane has held nearly every position, including captain and president, and is now the convention meeting planner for the New Jersey First Aid Council. He is pleased that the City will continue to support the Englewood Volunteer Ambulance Corps whose mission statement is, "We Save Lives." Krane stated that he enjoys serving for the Englewood Volunteer Ambulance Corps immensely, and that it runs in the family, with his son, two grandsons, and son-in-law all serving as members of the Corps.
